Classroom Expectations

The cost of maintaining school buildings and supplies is assumed by the taxpayer. Any additions created by deliberate acts of vandalism are, if the guilty person is undetected, also assumed by the taxpayer. School custodians are hired to maintain the school building, to keep it in good repair, and to keep it clean. Students are expected to keep the school free from littering, reporting incidents of vandalism and removing graffiti and litter whenever possible. Food and beverages must be consumed in designated areas. Smoking and or vaping is not allowed on School Board premises.

Respect for Property

The cost of maintaining school buildings and supplies is assumed by the taxpayer. Classroom Expectations

Academically, students are expected to achieve the expectations identified at each grade level by the Ontario Curriculum. Modifications and accommodations will be made to support those students who demonstrate difficulty in meeting grade level expectations. Students are expected to follow the Classroom Norms and School Code of Conduct. A copy of these are available from the classroom teacher and will be sent home in the first week of school or on our school webpage. Desks are part of school property and are subject to search.

School Code of Conduct

The Mine Centre School Code of Conduct outlines school expectations and consequences for inappropriate behavior. Please review the Mine Centre School Code of Conduct with your child/ren. A copy can be located on our school web page.

Illness

If a student becomes ill at school, the office will contact the parent/guardian or emergency designate and request that the student be picked up. Students should return to school after they pass the Ontario School and Child Care Screening tool (https://www.ontario.ca/school-screening). Having up to date contact information is essential so that contact tracing can easily occur if required.

Lockdown Drills

Students and staff regularly participate in school lockdown drills. These drills are designed to prepare students and staff should an intruder enter the school grounds or building. Students are to conduct themselves in a respectful, responsible manner during safety drills. Physical distancing and all other Covid-19 related measures will be in place during lockdowns.

Personal Electronic Devices

To encourage positive relationship building and healthy recess activities, this year, Mine Centre School will be PED free. Students and staff are asked to leave their PED's in their bags or at home. Should students or staff choose to bring their PED's for the bus ride to school, they should be placed in their bags upon arrival. In addition, to reduce the amount of touch surfaces, students are asked to leave toys and non-essential items at home. The less there is to touch, the less the chance of catching any type of virus.

Bussing

The school bus is an extension of the school, and the "Code of Conduct" applies to students who ride the bus. While on or waiting for the bus, students must act in a responsible manner and follow all directions given by the driver and as taught by school staff. Students must sit in their assigned seats and refrain from eating and drinking on the bus. To increase ventilation, windows of the bus will be opened by the driver, whenever weather permits. As per Rainy River District School Board guidelines, students will have only one pick up and drop off point. The school cannot accommodate requests for bussing changes.

Nutrition Breaks

Students enjoy a break from the morning and afternoon routines during which time they can get some fresh air and enjoy unstructured time while physically distancing with their friends. All of us are better able to work after a short break and a healthy snack. All students who eat lunch at school during the two nutrition breaks remain under the supervision and jurisdiction of the school for the entire break. Microwaves are not available in the classrooms. The use of thermoses is encouraged. In addition, students will need to bring their own cutlery and a water bottle that can be refilled at our water filling station. Water fountains are unavailable. Our expectation is that all students will participate in outdoor breaks. Exceptions to this practice will be made in very special cases. During inclement or extremely cold conditions we will conduct indoor recesses.

Nutrition Programs

Food will be 'grab and go' foods such as whole fruits, cereal bars and packaged items. All precautions prescribed by the NWHU for food preparation and distribution will be followed carefully.

Outdoor Education

This year more than ever, students will be learning and playing outdoors as much as possible. In order for children to fully participate in outdoor learning, they must be dressed appropriately. Stable footwear, a jacket or sweater and a hat are important. Please ensure your child dresses for time spent outdoors each and every day.

Prevalent Medical Conditions

If your child suffers from asthma, diabetes, anaphylaxis or other serious medical conditions, please contact the school office. We will work together to create a plan of care that fits the needs of your child.

Before School Arrival and After School Departure

Thank you to all parents and caregivers of students who are walking or using personal transportation. Please ensure that children are arriving after 8:15 am and departing just following the end of the school day at 2:50. Your efforts will help to ensure safety of your child before and after school.

Attendance and Safe Arrival Programs

In the interest of student safety and effective programming, it is important that student absences are accounted for in all schools of the Rainy River District School Board. This includes both brick and mortar schools and online schools. If a student is to be late or absent, parents/guardians must call the school and leave a message on the school telephone voicemail system stating the child's full name, grade, and reason for not attending school. Late Arrivals

Students are considered late if they arrive at school after either of the two entry/attendance recording times during the day (8:30 am and 1:20 pm). Students arriving after these times must report to the office to be signed in by our secretary.

Sign In and Out

Students leaving the school before the regular dismissal times must be signed out at the office by our school secretary before leaving. A text or phone call to the school office is required to provide the reason for the early dismissal and the length of absence. Students returning from appointments, as well as those who are late, must be signed in at the office. Parents, upon arrival are to call the office and your child will be walked out to the parents' vehicle by office staff.

School Visitors

School visitors are not allowed at this time. If you need to drop off or pick up your child or anything for your child, please call the office and schedule a time. Someone will come out to greet you.
